

# **Report on Industrial Visit at Guru Ganesh Graphics Ltd**

In an effort to bridge the gap between classroom learning and real-world application, students from G.K.Joshi (Night) Commerce College, Latur recently embarked on an enlightening industrial visit to a renowned Printing Press located in the Industrial Area of Latur City. The primary objective of this industrial visit to printing press 2025 was to provide the students with a first-hand experience of the intricate processes involved in the world of printing, including printing, cutting, binding, and lamination.

This industrial visit was most useful to the students in the way of understood the concept of different types of sensors, electrical drivers and control used in the printing machineries and also understand concepts behind the 3D printing. Mr. Sheetal Baldota, the owner, has vast experience in the industry and was an excellent source of information and answered all questions patiently. The students were introduced to the printing process and the mechanism in which the machinery works. Photopolymer sheets that are used in printing were showcased and students had the opportunity to inspect the same. The organization implements an offset printing/indirect printing process to gain superior quality print. This opportunity not only deepened their understanding of the field but also allowed them to witness the seamless integration of design and production.

A total of 20 students of B.Com IIIrd year along with 2 faculty members (Dr.Sujata Chavan and Asst.Prof. Priti Pachange visited Guru Ganesh Graphics Ltd on 15/03/2025 at 11:30 am. The visit was structured to cover the entire printing process, encompassing pre-press, press, and post-press stages.

### 1. Pre-Press

The students were introduced to the pre-press stage, which involves the preparation and finalization of materials before they are sent to the printing press. This stage includes tasks such as image processing, colour separation, and proofing. The students witnessed how digital files, designed in the classroom, are meticulously prepared for the actual printing process. They gained a new appreciation for the attention to detail required to ensure the accurate reproduction of designs.

### 2. Press

The heart of the printing press is undoubtedly the press itself. During this phase of the visit, students observed the complex machinery in action. They saw how the designs they had created were transferred onto various materials like paper and cardboard using offset printing technology. This process involves precise registration of colours, the application of ink, and the mechanical precision necessary to ensure that every print is consistent and of high quality.

## 3. Post-Press

In the post-press phase, students delved into the final steps that transform printed sheets into finished products. This phase includes cutting, binding, and lamination, among other processes. The students were able to witness the intricacies of cutting machines, binding equipment, and lamination processes. They saw how these techniques added the final touch to the printed materials, making them ready for distribution and use.

The industrial visit not only offered a comprehensive view of the printing process but also highlighted the importance of teamwork, coordination, and quality control in a printing press. All the students got to understand about the relations between the digital designing and printing process.

Throughout the visit, the students engaged with experienced professionals who shared their insights and knowledge, answering questions and providing guidance.
